

Learning in school...

Year 6 have been learning about the circulatory system and had the opportunity to dissect lamb's hearts. They looked at the external features, used liquid to see where the blood flows and then cut into the hearts to investigate the internal structure.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

The pupil premium is additional school funding for disadvantaged children. It is paid directly to your child's school to improve the quality of their education. School also use this funding to fund extra-curricular clubs, trips (including residential) and music instrument lessons.

Your child's school may be entitled to pupil premium funding if you receive one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Child Tax Credit Only (with income up to £16,190) with no element of Working Tax Credit
- National Asylum Seekers Support
- Guarantee Element of the State Pension Credit
- Employment and Support Allowance (income related)
- Universal Credit (income dependant)

How does my school get the pupil premium for my child?

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 - All children at this age are eligible for free school meals so you will need to apply separately for the pupil premium for your child's school. Please be aware that a child must reside with the applicant to receive the pupil premium.

If your child is in year 3 and above, and you want to check eligibility for pupil premium, please use the free school meals form to apply for pupil premium entitlement. The school the child is attending will automatically get a pupil premium amount if the child is eligible for free school meals.
