KEY STAGE 2 READING SCHEME

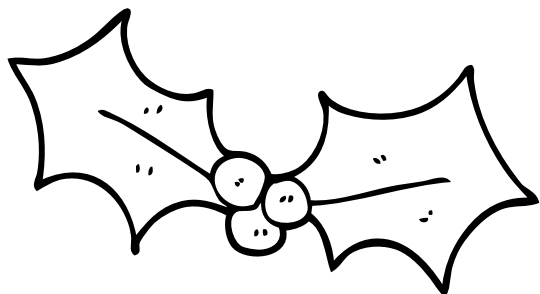
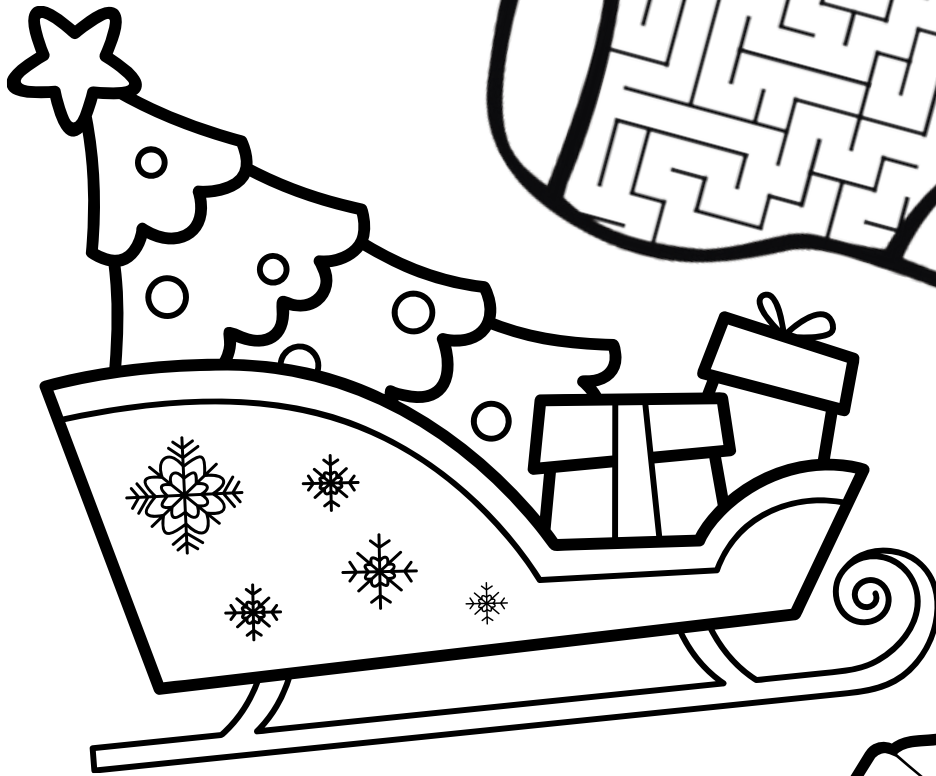
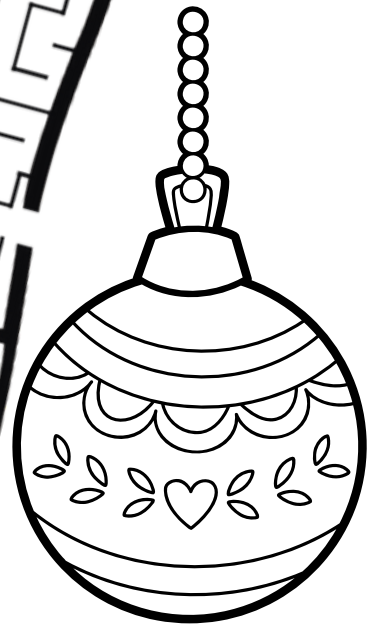
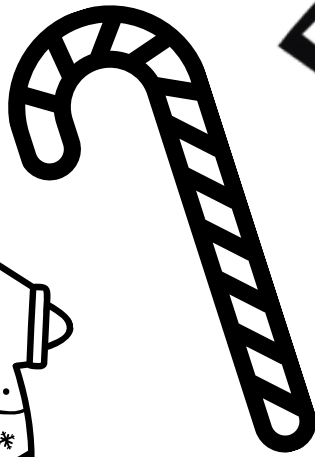

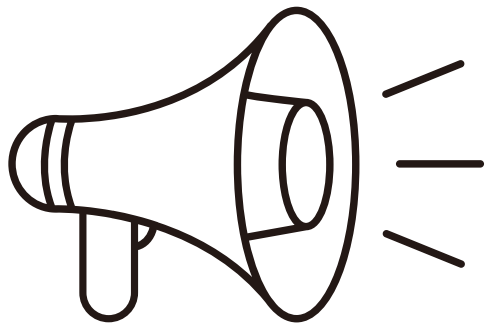


FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Primary children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive free school meals under the Universal Free School Meal scheme. You may also be entitled to apply for free school meals for your children if you receive one of the below income related benefits:

- Income support
- Income based job seekers allowance
- Income related employment and support allowance
- Child tax credit combined with a both a household income below £16,190 per annum and not in receipt of any working tax credit
- Support under the immigration and asylum act 1999
- Guarantee element of state pension credit
- Universal Credit - annual household earnings of less than £7400




