
This term our topics are:

Marvellous Machines

This project teaches children about the technology that is part of their daily lives and how machines help us. This will give our children the opportunity to build and create marvellous machines. We will look at how machines have changed over time and use some of these machines ourselves, to cook.

Puppets and Pop Ups - This creative project explores puppets and pop up books and gives children the opportunity to make puppets and use them to tell exciting stories.

How I can help my child at home. Supporting at home...

Reading – The books your child is bringing home with them are for adults to read and share. Your child has chosen the book for themselves. Sometimes they may choose to keep the book as they are enjoying the story or they choose a book that they have at home. Knowing books 'of by heart' is great!

Phonics – We are continuing to learn and revise the sounds we need to know for learning to read. We will spend lots of time helping the children to hear sounds and push them together to recognise the word. E.G. c....a....t each sound is said and then the children have to guess the word. We call it Fred Talk. Have a go at home.

Number – Practise counting.

Use everyday opportunities to get your children counting accurately. E.G. Count plates, cutlery, biscuits. Encourage them to touch and move the objects as they count to make sure they say one number at a time.
