Geography – Sow, grow and farm

In Geography, the children will learn about land use in the UK. They will learn about allotments and farming in the UK. They will work on maps, grid references and climate zones. They will explore physical features of North and South America and look at farming in North and South America. They will find out how food is transported.

Geography – Frozen Kingdoms

In Geography, the children will learn about the Arctic and Antarctic regions. They will do further work on lines of latitude and longitude. They will explore polar climates and polar day and night as well as polar oceans and polar landscapes. They will focus on climate change, natural resources and the indigenous people. Finally, they will look at tourism in these regions.

Art – Nature’s Art

In Art, the children will learn about the genre of land art. They will work outdoors to sketch natural forms and explore the sculptural potential of natural materials before working collaboratively to create land art installations.

Art – Environmental Artists

In Art, the children will learn about the genre of environmental art. They will study how artists create artwork that addresses social and political issues related to the natural and urban environment. The children will work collaboratively to create artwork with an environmental message.

Science – Human reproduction and ageing

In Science, the children will learn about animal life cycles, including the human life cycle. They will explore human growth and development to old age, including the changes experienced during puberty and human reproduction.

Science – Electrical components and circuits

In Science, the children will learn about electrical circuits, their components and how they function. They will recognise how the voltage of cells affects the output of a circuit and record circuits using standard symbols. They will carry out investigations linked with both electrical components and voltage.
