Year 1 Curriculum	Year 2 Curriculum
<p>History – Childhood</p> <p>In History, the children will learn to use historical vocabulary. They will explore historical artefacts and Timelines. They will learn about everyday life and childhood in the 1950s and the Queen's coronation.</p>	<p>History – Movers and shakers</p> <p>In History, children about historically significant people who have had a major impact on the world. They will learn to use timelines, stories and historical sources to find out about the people featured and use historical models to explore their significance.</p>
<p>Science – Everyday Materials</p> <p>In Science, children will learn that objects are made from materials. They identify a range of everyday materials and their sources. Children investigate the properties of materials and begin to recognise that a material's properties define its use.</p>	<p>Science – Human Survival</p> <p>In Science, the children will learn about the basic needs of humans for survival, including the importance of exercise, nutrition and good hygiene. They learn how human offspring grow and change over time into adulthood.</p>
<p>Art – Mix it (Y1)</p> <p>In Art, the children will learn about basic colour theory by studying the colour wheel and colour mixing. It includes an exploration of primary and secondary colours and how artists use colour in their artwork.</p>	<p>DT – Remarkable recipes</p> <p>In DT, the children will learn about sources of food and tools used for food preparation. They also discover why some foods are cooked and learn to read a simple recipe. The children choose and make a new school meal that fulfils specific design criteria.</p>

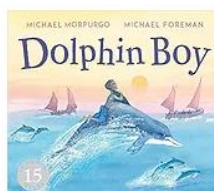
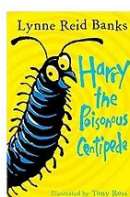
English
